An Interview with ANSC Undergraduate Student Samantha Doyle on Her Internship at the Georgia Aquarium

Q: Where did you intern, and when?

I interned at the Georgia Aquarium with the Pinniped Department over the summer of 2018.

Q: Was it a paid internship? What did you do there?

This was not a paid internship. I spent a lot of time cleaning or assisting in the preparation of the diets for the 13 sea lions we cared for. I was welcome to watch all of the training sessions and, every so often, some of the shows that occurred throughout the day. The internship also featured a lecture series, and I was able to learn a lot about animal behavior, husbandry, and training. There were multiple projects; one where I created a new piece of enrichment for the animals, and another where I learned about four behaviors the animals are routinely asked. I was eventually able to participate in the sea lion shows, where I spoke about the relationships trainers have with each of the sea lions.
